Central Georgia EMC looks out for the interests of our customer-owners. We offer a variety of energy solutions that are based on need, convenience, and energy efficiency. If you are not already familiar with our programs, take a moment to see if any of them fit your current or future needs.

Looking for green energy options?

Our **Cooperative Solar** program is inspired by the desires of our customer-owners to participate in

clean, renewable, solar energy sources without the worry of maintenance, contracts, or costly installations. You can become part of the Cooperative Solar program for \$19 per block, per month.



In addition to Cooperative Solar, we offer our customer-owners the option to support **Green Power**, an environmentally

friendly, biomass-produced energy source. Through our partner, Green Power EMC, customer-owners can purchase 150 kilowatt-hour blocks for the added per-block price of \$4.50 per month on their power bill. The power obtained is generated from the Taylor County landfill and reduces harmful methane in the environment while producing clean energy.

Want to stay connected and protected?

We have some of the fastest internet options available to rural customers with satellite broadband internet from Exede by ViaSat. We are glad to answer any questions and help you determine if Exede will work for your internet needs. Electronic devices contain delicate components, and in many cases are connected to other points of entry like phone lines, antennas, satellite, or cable, making them more sensitive to fluctuations in current or voltage levels. Create a wall of protection from damaging surges caused by lightning or other electrical events with meter-base mounted surge protection for \$5.75 per month plus tax. Point-of-use surge protection is also available as an added layer of protection for these types of sensitive electronics.



According to the unique cooperative business



principles that govern our not-for-profit business model, capital credits may be returned to each customer-owner on a pro-rata basis, with a schedule determined by Central Georgia EMC management and the board of directors.
