

Central Georgia EMC is pleased to announce that once again, our rates fall among the lowest in the state according to the Summer 2018 Residential Rate Survey from the Georgia Public Service Commission.

Out of all 94 electric providers in Georgia, CGEMC is the 5th lowest-cost provider at the 1,500 kilowatt-hours (kWh) level and the 4th lowest at the 2,000 kWh level. At the 2,000 kWh level, CGEMC customer-owners save \$52.31 per month over the state average and \$88.65 per month over the rates paid by Georgia Power's customers. Those are some numbers to get excited about!

Load Management Switch Program Savings

We would like to thank all customer-owners who participated in the 2018 Load Management Switch Program. Participating customers can look for an annual bill credit on their November statement (\$20 for an air-conditioning switch and \$10 for a water heater switch, with a \$30 maximum credit).

CGEMC enacted load management six times from June 1, 2018, to August 31, 2018, for a total energy savings of about 322,000 kilowatt-hours during peak energy use times.

Scammers have been known to call posing as utility personnel, demanding immediate payment to avoid disconnection. In some cases, scammers have shown up at homes or businesses making the same demand. Here are a few tips to avoid scammers posing as Central Georgia EMC:

- While we do make courtesy calls when an account is past due, those calls are made in advance of the disconnect date.
- In most circumstances, meters are disconnected from the office remotely. In the rare occurrence that a technician is dispatched, they will have proper identification. When in doubt, close the door and call local authorities.
- Protect your personal and financial information. Call CGEMC directly at 770-775-7857 to confirm the status of your account and your account balance.

From the kitchen of Vangie Green



Ingredients:

16 ounces of cream cheese, softened 1 package dry Ranch-style dip mix 1 cup mayonnaise

2 (8 oz.) packages refrigerated crescent rolls

½ cup finely grated each of any of the following: broccoli, cauliflower, carrots, or any finely chopped vegetable of choice.

½ cup finely chopped tomatoes (seeds removed)

½ cup chopped scallions

Instructions:

Unroll the crescent rolls onto a nonstick baking sheet in a single layer. Seal the perforations and prick with a fork. Bake for 10 minutes at 350 until golden brown, remove from the oven, and allow to cool completely.

Combine the cream cheese, mayonnaise, and Ranch-style dressing mix, blending until smooth. Spread the cream cheese mixture onto cooled crescent rolls in an even layer.

Sprinkle the grated vegetables on top of the cream cheese and lightly press down. Cover and refrigerate for one hour. Cut into bars and bring to room temperature before serving.
