Fall Means It's Time for an HVAC Check-Up!

Every fall, before it gets too chilly outside, call a qualified heating and air conditioning technician to give your central heating system a once-over. Regularly maintaining your heating unit will help prevent a breakdown on a cold night during the dead of winter.

Between annual check-ups, you can head off trouble by paying attention to your heating system. Here's how:

- Replace your system's air filter once every three months. Dirty filters can get clogged and prevent air flow.
- When you turn the heat on for the first time this fall, listen for banging, rattling, or other unusual sounds, which could be a symptom of a malfunction-in-the-making.
- If your windows steam up or you see rust or a lot of dirt on your heating vents, something is wrong.

Summer Succotash Salad Courtesy of Georgia Grown



Ingredients:

8 ears fresh sweet corn (in husks)
1 Vidalia onion
2 cups edamame peas
1-2 cups cherry tomatoes
1 cup olive oil
1/4 cup tarragon, chopped

Instructions:

Peel back corn husk halfway and soak corn in cold water for 15-20 minutes. Slice onion crosswise 1/2-inch thick. Place both corn (still in husks) and onion on grill and cook for 5-10 minutes, making sure to flip them every so often. Remove corn and onion from grill. Remove husks and slice corn kernels off of the cobs. Roughly chop the onion into bite-sized cubes. Place corn kernels and chopped onion in a large bowl.

Boil edamame peas for 2-3 minutes then drain. Add edamame peas to bowl with corn and onion. Slice cherry tomatoes and add to bowl. Drizzle in olive oil and sprinkle with tarragon. Toss lightly to coat all ingredients.
