81st Annual Meeting

Central Georgia Electric Membership Corporation held its 81st Annual Meeting of Members at the Central Georgia EMC Annex Building in Butts County, Georgia at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 1, 2018. Registration began at 8:00 a.m.

Mr. D. T. Hamil, Chairman of the Board, called the meeting to order and announced that 694 members were registered. Mr. Hamil thanked the entertainment, Mr. Michael O'Ouinn. The invocation for the meeting was provided by Father Jose Kochuparampil, the Priest of St. Mary, Mother of God Catholic Church in Jackson. Audrie Anne McKenney, a fifth-grader at Unity Grove Elementary School in Locust Grove, sang the National Anthem.

Mr. Hamil introduced the Board of Directors. George L. Weaver, President/ CEO, recognized the special guests in attendance. Mr. Weaver presented the Management Report. Mr. Hamil announced registration was closed and a total of 713 members registered.

Mr. Terry McMichael, CPA, affirmed that Central Georgia EMC was a strong financial organization with total assets of over \$240.5 million in 2017. The corporation's total equity was over \$83.2 million. In 2017, more than \$2.3 million was returned to the members in the form of capital credits. The financial position of CGEMC remains solid.

Mr. J. O. Colwell representing Butts County; and Mr. Phillip B. Ham, Jr. representing Bibb and Monroe counties; and Mr. D. T. Hamil representing Spalding, Lamar, and Pike Counties (Post No. 1), each of whom was unopposed, were re-elected by acclamation for a three-year term.

The meeting was adjourned and members participated in the drawing of prizes, a picnic lunch of grilled hot dogs, potato chips, ice cream sandwiches, and cold drinks.

Service Charge Adjustment Effective October 1, 2018

Effective with October 1, 2018, billings, Central Georgia EMC's monthly service charge for residential accounts will change from \$25 to \$28. The monthly charge for general service and commercial accounts will also increase by \$3. This change is part of a continual effort to align charges with operational and wholesale power costs.

The service charge covers portions of costs associated with account administration, power distribution, capacity, and other related expenses. Despite this adjustment, Central Georgia EMC remains one of the lowest-cost electric providers in all of Georgia.

Slow Cooker Pulled Barbecue Chicken

From the kitchen of Molly Horton



Ingredients:

1 bottle barbecue sauce of choice 1/2 cup Italian salad dressing 1 teaspoon liquid smoke

2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

1/4 cup packed brown sugar 6 boneless chicken breasts

8 hamburger buns

Instructions:

Stir together all wet ingredients with brown sugar. Pour mixture into slow cooker. Add chicken, tossing to coat. Cover and cook 5-6 hours on low. Shred chicken with two forks, serve on buns.



Turn off the kitchen, bath, and other exhaust fans within 20 minutes after you are done cooking or bathing. When replacing exhaust fans, consider installing high-efficiency, low-noise models.
