Introducing Time-of-Use Pricing

Central Georgia EMC is pleased to introduce a Time-of-Use (TOU) rate option. Beginning this month, residential customer-owners can have more control of costs by shifting electricity use from periods when prices are highest (on-peak) to periods when prices are lowest (off-peak). This avoids use of less efficient, more costly generation sources and reduces stress on the electric grid.



Electricity used during the hours of 2-8 p.m., Monday through Friday, June through September (excluding the observed Independence Day and Labor Day holidays) is on-peak and subject to a higher cost per kilowatt-hour (kWh). All other hours are considered off-peak and carry a lower cost per kWh. If you are interested in learning more about TOU, contact our Customer Service department, and a representative will help you determine if this option is right for you.

Notice of 2016 Capital Credit Assignments

Central Georgia EMC (CGEMC) announces that the capital credit assignment for 2016 is 3.52 percent. In an electric cooperative structure such as CGEMC, each dollar paid in excess of the cost of providing service is an investment in CGEMC by its customer-owners. This allocated amount to each customer-owner is kept on permanent record in our office.

At the end of the year, after all expenses are paid, any remaining funds are assigned to customer-owners' accounts. CGEMC's margins are used as capital until they can be returned through a general refund without impairing the cooperative's financial condition.

Your capital credit assignment is calculated by multiplying your total electric bill for the year, minus the sales tax and any miscellaneous charges, times the 3.52 percent.

Example:

If your annual bill totaled:	Your assignment is:
\$ 150 X .0352	\$ 5.28
\$ 300 X .0352	\$ 10.56
\$ 500 X .0352	\$ 17.60
\$ 1,000 X .0352	\$ 35.20

NOTE: Assignments do not include Central Georgia EMC large power accounts.

Walter Harrison Scholarship Winner Announced

Central Georgia EMC (CGEMC) is honored to announce that Victoria Smith, a Jackson High School student, is the deserving recipient of a \$1,000 college scholarship. Victoria is one of 10 students statewide who will receive a Walter Harrison Scholarship, sponsored by the electric co-ops in Georgia, including CGEMC.

This year, Victoria competed among 76 other students who applied for the \$1,000 scholarship, which helps offset rising costs associated with obtaining a two-year or four-year college degree. The winners were required to submit brief essays explaining why they would be good candidates for the scholarship, and outlining their education and career goals.

A statewide panel of judges considered factors such as academic excellence (judged by performance, grade-point average, SAT scores, and academic honors), extracurricular activities such as participation in student clubs and organizations, and a commitment to serve others. Recommendation letters from academic counselors and teachers were considered as well.

Victoria is the daughter of Adam and Debbie Smith, of Jackson. She will study radiology at Gordon State College, with the goal of becoming a radiologic technologist.

Recipe of the Month



Vidalia Onion Casserole

Ingredients:

- 6 jumbo Vidalia onions, thinly sliced
- 1 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 pack butter style crackers, crushed
- ½ cup butter

Directions:

Sauté onions in butter until soft. In a two-quart casserole dish, layer half the onions, half the Parmesan cheese, and half the crackers. Repeat layers. (Casserole can be refrigerated at this point and baked later.) Bake at 325 degrees for 30 minutes.
