
The HomePlus Loan is for the purchase and installation of the following types of equipment in existing homes:

- Weatherization items (weather stripping, caulking, sealing, and insulation ductwork)

Ingredients:

- 1 (32-oz.) bag frozen hash browns, thawed
- 1/2 cup margarine, melted
- 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 1 (8-oz) container sour cream
- 1 cans (10.75-oz.) cream of chicken soup
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

Topping:

1/2 cup margarine, melted 2 cups cornflakes, crushed

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a bowl, combine soup, sour cream, cheese, margarine, and thawed hash browns. Pour into a 9 by 13-inch greased baking dish. Add topping and bake for 45-60 minutes until golden brown on top.
