
# **Your Source for Low-Cost Energy**

According to the Georgia Public Service Commission's Summer 2017 Residential Rate Survey, Central Georgia EMC (CGEMC) ranks among the *four lowest-cost* electric providers in the state. The survey ranks the 94 electric providers in Georgia based on average bill amounts for 500 kilowatt-hours (kWh), 1,000 kWh, 1,500 kWh, and 2,000 kWh use levels.

CGEMC is the third lowest-cost provider at the 2,000-kWh level and the fourth lowest at the 1,500-kWh level. Central Georgia EMC customer-owners experience a significant savings when compared to the state average.

Central Georgia EMC's dedication to keeping rates as low as possible allows us to pass these savings on to you. We look out for you by working together to keep electric bills affordable, controlling costs through innovation, and by putting you, our customer-owners, first.

## **Central Georgia Scores High on Member Satisfaction**

Touchstone Energy cooperatives such as Central Georgia EMC (CGEMC) are ranked higher in overall customer satisfaction, significantly outpacing investor-owned electric utilities and municipal sector utilities, according to findings released by the American Customer Satisfaction Index (ACSI). Central Georgia EMC scored 87 out of 100 for overall customer satisfaction. The average for Touchstone Energy cooperatives as a whole is 78, the investor-owned utility sector average is 75, and the municipal electric provider sector averages 74.

CGEMC is dedicated to customer service. Our ACSI score of 87 reinforces the principle that as a not-for-profit electric cooperative, Central Georgia EMC focuses on serving members rather than focusing on maximizing profits for shareholders. We strive for continual improvement in all that we do, and our goal is to move our score even higher.

The cooperative business model also increases member loyalty. According to the ACSI Retention Index for the second guarter 2017, the likelihood that a member will continue to do business with the Central Georgia EMC (82) is far higher than those who

get their electric service from an investor-owned utility (73), or a municipal electric service provider (70). Your satisfaction is our priority.

You will see our bucket trucks at local schools for career days and safety demonstrations. We visit local community groups to talk about energy conservation, money-saving tips, and electrical safety. Each year, we sponsor two student delegates for the Washington Youth Tour and offer

the Walter Harrison Scholarship opportunity for students.

We are involved in local Rotary Clubs and Chambers of Commerce across our territory. You will find our booth at many local festivals in the spring and fall. We keep our connection to you and our communities strong, maintaining our commitment to be *your source of power and information*.

## Always-a-Hit Pizza Dip

#### **Ingredients:**

8-ounce package of cream cheese, softened
8 ounces of sour cream
1 tablespoon garlic powder
16-ounce jar of pizza sauce
1 1/2 cups mixture of shredded mozzarella and cheddar cheeses
Pepperoni slices
Tortilla chips

#### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine cream cheese, sour cream, and garlic powder mix to paste. Line the bottom of baking dish with the cream cheese mixture. Spread pizza sauce evenly over cream cheese layer and top with shredded cheeses. Generously place pepperoni slices on top of cheese, as they will shrink during baking. Bake uncovered for 30 minutes. Serve hot with tortilla chips. Serves 4-6.
