80th Annual Meeting

Central Georgia Electric Membership Corporation held its 80th Annual Meeting of Members at the Central Georgia EMC Annex Building in Butts County, Georgia at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 2, 2017. Registration began at 8:00 a.m.

Mr. D. T. Hamil, Chairman of the Board, called the meeting to order and thanked the entertainment, Melton Campbell and Saving Grace. The invocation was provided by Bishop Watkins of New Covenant Church of God in McDonough.

Mr. Hamil introduced the Board of Directors. Mr. George Weaver, CGEMC President/CEO, recognized the special guests in attendance and presented the Management Report. Mr. Hamil announced registration was closed, and a total of 688 members registered.

Mr. Terry McMichael, CPA, affirmed that CGEMC was a strong financial organization with total assets of more than \$219.6 million in 2016. The corporation's total equity was over \$80.2 million. In 2016, over \$2 million was returned to members in the form of capital credits. The financial position of CGEMC remains solid.

Mr. D. A. Robinson, III, representing Spalding, Pike, and Lamar counties (Post No. 2); and Mr. Arthur White, Jr. repre-

senting "At-Large" (Post No. 2), were re-elected by acclamation for three-year terms.

The meeting was adjourned. Members participated in the drawing of prizes, a picnic lunch of grilled hot dogs, potato chips, ice cream sandwiches, and soft drinks.



Energy Advisor

Start by visiting the Energy Solutions section of our website, www.cgemc.com, and take advantage of the Energy Advisor tool. Energy Advisor allows you to log in using your CGEMC account number and ZIP code. You will walk through a short series of specific questions, and the tool will compare your responses with your actual energy use. A detailed analysis of your home's electrical use will be created. Specific suggestions for conserving energy in your home will estimate savings based on making simple changes to your electricity use habits. The process takes less than 15 minutes, but the potential savings will last much longer.

The Home Energy Adventure is an educational tool supported by our partner, Touchstone Energy, and is now available on our website. Converting from a natural gas furnace \$400 to a 16 SEER or greater traditional electric heat pump or VRF system

Converting from a natural gas furnace \$250 to a system that is less than 16 SEER traditional electric heat pump

Replacing an existing heat pump or electric furnace \$400 for a 16 SEER or greater traditional heat pump or VRF conversion/add-on

Water Heater Rebates

Electric water heater: Conversion from gas to electric storage water heater \$150

Electric water heater: Replacement of existing electric storage water heater \$100

Total electric new home rebate—up to \$700 available per home (Please see our website for details)

Solar energy system rebate—a one-time rebate of \$450 per kilowatt, with a 10-kilowatt cap for qualifying solar energy systems. (*Qualifications and restrictions may apply, please see our website for full details*)
